As the IUCN Red List Authority for birds, BirdLife reassessed the status of 238 bird species in 2017, leading to a change in Red List Category for 135 species. The tables below summarises these changes, along with the new taxonomic changes recognised by BirdLife.



THE NEXT PASSENGER PIGEON?

Rising from Least Concern to Critically Endangered in just 13 years, and despite being widespread across Asia, the Yellow-breasted Bunting *Emberiza aureola* risks becoming the next Passenger Pigeon. Its shocking decline is due to excessive trapping in China (mainly for food), sold on the black market despite a ban in 1997.




FALCON NOW GLOBALLY THREATENED

The migratory Sooty Falcon Falco concolor has been uplisted from Near Threatened to Vulnerable. New estimates suggest that its population size may number fewer than 10,000 mature individuals, and declines have been recorded across much of its breeding range in northeast Africa and the Middle East.



DUCK DECLINES IN AFRICA

The Maccoa Duck Oxyura maccoa of eastern and southern Africa has undergone recent rapid declines, and as a result the species has been uplisted from Near Threatened to Vulnerable. While the direct causes of these declines remain uncertain, pollution, habitat loss and entanglement in gill nets may all be involved.





GOOD NEWS FROM THE GALÁPAGOS

The Floreana Mockingbird *Mimus trifasciatus*, now found only on two tiny islets, has recovered since 2007, when fewer than 50 adults remained. Following a series of successful breeding seasons, the population has risen to more than 750 individuals, justifying its downlisting from Critically Endangered to Endangered.



RAT CONTROL A RELIEF FOR WREN

Cobb's Wren *Troglodytes cobbi* has been downlisted to Least Concern, thanks to the control of invasive rats on nearby islands. Residing on the remaining predator-free islands of the Falklands (Malvinas), it was formerly listed as Vulnerable due to the probability of rat invasion – but this threat is now far less likely.



FOREST OWLET HABITAT FOUND

Confined to a few forest locations encroached upon by logging, the Forest Owlet *Heteroglaux blewitti* of central India moves from Critically Endangered to Endangered, following the discovery of populations in several completely new locations, including the first records in Gujarat.

*Some species are Data Deficient no more: on New Guinea, Mayr's Forest-rail Rallicula mayri has been assessed as Least Concern. Recent research in the Foja Mountains found it to be common to uncommon, and in the absence of any key threats it is thought to have a stable population.
